1. About Jubilee Debt Campaign

Jubilee Debt Campaign works to eradicate the poverty and injustice caused by debt around the world. Through education and campaigning on debt and the finance system, we work to strengthen the broader economic justice movement with the aim of advancing major structural changes to the global economy. Our vision is of a world where debt is no longer used as a form of power by which the rich exploit the poor, and where our common resources are used to realise equality, justice and human dignity.

Set up in 2001, we are the UK's successor to the Jubilee 2000 movement, and work closely with allies in the international debt justice movement. We are a coalition of local, regional and national affiliates, including local Jubilee Debt Campaign groups, faith-based groups, trade unions and international development organisations.

We are secular, independent of any political party, and committed to principles of nonviolence and equal opportunity.

2. The Post

This post will be responsible for two key areas of work:

- Leading on the coordination, development and implementation of the Economic Justice Project, a joint
 initiative between Jubilee Debt Campaign and People & Planet which delivers holistic and empowering
 education, training, and network-building focused on the root causes of social, economic and
 environmental justice, and supports the growth of a broad-based democratic movement calling for a just
 and sustainable economic system.
- 2. Helping to strengthen activism, mobilisation and public engagement around Jubilee Debt Campaign's priority campaigns, including growing our base of individual supporters and strengthening our work with them and with the local organisers and multipliers in our local groups network.

Our planned priority campaigns in 2016 are:

- 1. Warning of the threat of a new debt trap in the global South
- 2. Challenging the expensive and high risk Public Private Partnership investment model in the UK and globally
- 3. Demanding debt cancellation for countries affected by economic shocks and humanitarian crises

The post-holder will be based in the Jubilee Debt Campaign office with five other colleagues:

- Director
- Senior Policy & Campaigns Officer
- Senior Campaigns & Communications Officer
- Senior Finance & Administration Officer
- Campaigns & Administration Assistant

The post has a probationary period of 3 months. We offer 26 days leave per annum (plus bank holidays), and employers' contributions of up to 7.5% to a personal pension of the staff member's choosing.

We will consider applications from individuals who are interested in undertaking the post as a job share as well as from those who are applying for it a full-time position.

This is a temporary post but we hope to be able to make it permanent pending successful fundraising in 2016.

3. Job Description

This job description covers the broad range of responsibilities and activities of the post. Emphasis amongst these will vary throughout the course of the contract depending on the stage of project and campaign plans.

Overall Economic Justice Project Co-ordination

Overall joint project coordination with the co-coordinator at People & Planet, including project planning
and implementation, convening the project advisory group, and facilitating inputs from the Jubilee Debt
Campaign team and supporting partners and activist allies into the planning and delivery of activities

Activist Education, Training & Support

- Working with the People & Planet co-coordinator to develop and deliver high quality training on economic
 justice issues and essential campaign skills, either directly or by commissioning external trainings and
 facilitators
- Identifying and engaging potential individuals and groups for training and support, with an emphasis on expanding reach to marginalised communities and people who would not normally access these opportunities and resources
- Providing support and advice to Economic Justice Project participants and Jubilee Debt Campaign's local leaders and multipliers, including support with local level networking, advocacy and media work (either face-to-face or via phone, email or the internet), and helping to create mechanisms for peer to peer activist training and support

Engagement, Outreach & Movement-Building

- Building and maintaining relationships with a wide range of activists and civil society groups, including
 grassroots activists and local campaign groups, small NGOs and community organisations, trade union
 branches and existing economic justice networks, including ongoing consultation to identify opportunities
 for effective support and joint working
- Assisting with the development of Jubilee Debt Campaign's supporter database to improve understanding of our supporter base and the targeting of communications

Campaigns Activism, Events & Mobilisations

- Inputting into the development and implementation of Jubilee Debt Campaign's campaign engagement, activism and movement-building strategy, and helping to ensure early consideration of activism and mobilisation possibilities in campaign strategy development, and that campaign strategies are delivering on engagement, activism and movement-building goals
- Leading on the planning and delivery of events, for example public meetings, conferences, protests, and stunts, and on Jubilee Debt Campaign and Economic Justice Project presence at external events such as festivals
- Devising other opportunities for the involvement of local groups and individual supporters in the shaping of our campaigns
- Conceiving of and organising opportunities for creative, inspiring and impactful involvement of activists and the general public in our campaigns, including protests, teach-ins and mobilisations

Communications

- Inputting into development and implementation of Jubilee Debt Campaign's organisational communications strategy
- Advising on campaign communications outputs to increase the accessibility and effectiveness of our communications with supporters and the general public
- Contributing to the production of online and offline popular education materials

Fundraising

Contributing to fundraising for the Economic Justice Project and Jubilee Debt Campaign's campaigns
activism and engagement work, including drafting fundraising applications and reports and attending
meetings with current and potential donors

Finance & Budget Management

 Management of the Economic Justice Project budget and individual project budgets as agreed (for example budgets for stunts, events and campaign mobilisations)

Monitoring, Evaluation & Reporting

 Working in partnership with the People & Planet co-coordinator to ensure effective and ongoing monitoring and evaluation of the Economic Justice Project activities and timely and accurate reporting to donors

- Understanding of economic justice issues, for example the problems with neoliberalism and austerity
- Understanding of the ecosystem of UK activists and groups working for social, economic and environmental justice and how these connect to international movements
- Understanding of the developing theories and practices around power, privilege, oppression and liberation in activism and organising
- Ability to work effectively as part of a team, including listening to others and devising and delivering plans collectively

- Experience of budget management
- Ability to write clearly for a range of audiences
- Ability and willingness to travel and work out of hours, including some evenings and weekends as agreed
